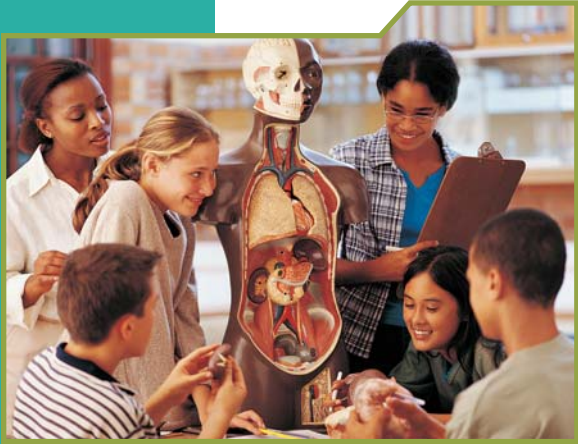

The Commonwealth College Course Collaborative (CCCC) is a common set of subjects that allows Virginia students the opportunity to earn a semester’s worth of college credit while still in high school. The CCCC is comprised of 13 credit hours that are accepted at all of the participating colleges and universities for degree credit. At some colleges, students may have the option to earn as many as 20 additional degree credit hours. By taking advantage of the CCCC, students can reduce the time required to earn a college degree, or use the extra time for additional learning opportunities.

Courses included in CCCC

- Introduction to Biology (BIO 101)
- Introduction to Psychology (PSY 201)
- US History I (HIS 121)
- US History II (HIS 122)

Second semester courses (e.g., BIO 102 and PSY 202), as well as other core courses (e.g., ENG 111/112, ECO 201/202, PLS 211, etc.) may also be transferred to many colleges and universities as described in their transfer guides. Save Time and Money

Students who complete the CCCC may potentially save thousands of dollars and time needed to complete a two- or four-year college degree.

All public two- and four-year colleges and universities in Virginia (except VMI), as well as the 24 undergraduate private institutions that comprise of the Council of Independent Colleges in Virginia (except Liberty University), allow students to transfer the CCCC courses to their programs upon satisfactory completion.
