Course Prefix and Number: EMS 159 Credits: 3

**Course Title:** ALS – Special Populations

**Course Description:** Continues the Virginia Office of Emergency Medical Services Intermediate and/or Paramedic curricula. Focuses on the assessment and management of specialty patients, including obstetrical, pediatric, neonates, and geriatrics. Prerequisites: EMS 151 and EMS 153. Prerequisite or Co-requisite: EMS 155. Lecture 2 hours. Laboratory 2 hours. Total 4 hours per week.

**General Course Purpose:** To prepare the EMS student to assess, evaluate, and treat patients within the special populations and how to use assessment-based management.

## **Course Objectives:**
