Reynolds is seeking applicants who share in its commitment to students and teamwork. These positions will be assigned to the School of Nursing and Allied Health, located on the Downtown Campus, 700 E. Jackson Street.

TYPE OF APPOINTMENT: Full-time nine-month teaching faculty-ranked appointment. Salary commensurate with the education and experience of the applicant. Salary range: \$32,832 - \$108,508. Approximate maximum hiring salary: \$65,000.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED: Master's degree in Nursing from a nationally accredited college or university. An unrestricted Registered Nurse's license. Minimum of two (2) years of full-time direct client care nursing experience or its equivalent within the past five (5) years or two (2) years of full-time teaching in nursing education or its equivalent (30 credits is equal to 1 year). Preference will be given to candidates who have experience in community, wellness/illness, chronic care and geriatric work and previous teaching experience. The selected candidate must be able to successfully pass the college's pre-employment security screening.

QUALIFICATIONS PREFERRED: Minimum two (2) years of recent teaching experience in a nursing program. Demonstrated ability to teach effectively in both didactic and clinical settings, including course development, student assessment, course evaluations and advising. Education to include principles of teaching and learning. Demonstrated ability to incorporate technology routinely into instructional responsibilities (multimedia, flipped classroom teaching strategies, and test construction). Demonstrated understanding of concept-based teaching principles; Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing. Demonstrated ability to work with diverse student populations in an urban setting.

POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES: The primary responsibility is teaching. Faculty loads are normally scheduled on an average load of fifteen (15) credit hours per semester. Office hours, advising and collateral duty assignments, such as college and department meetings are maintained. Teaching schedules may include day, evening and weekend classes and multiple campus and off-campus clinical assignments. Opportunities for summer teaching will be based on student interest.
